Details of Planning Phase

May include fact-finding, identification and selection of suppliers, development of specifications or protocols, environmental/capacity assessment etc

Countries along the Mekong River (Thailand, Cambodia, Myanmar, Laos and Vietnam) faces a significant burden of HPB diseases, with marked disparities in access to surgical care. While Thailand boasts a robust healthcare infrastructure capable of managing complex HPB disorders, countries like Cambodia struggle with limited resources and surgical expertise in this field. In Vietnam, although major cities have developed HPB care, there remains a pressing need to expand these services to hospitals in provincial areas. During Cambodia's 2023 IHPBA outreach program, we observed minimal collaboration among surgeons across Mekong countries, despite their geographical closeness. The current collaboration initiative, alongside strengthening HPB surgical care in Cambodia and Vietnam, aims to establish a "Mekong HPB Alliance" to foster a durable network for HPB surgery across these nations. The program will involve faculty from Thailand, Cambodia, Myanmar, Laos and Vietnam in addition to faculty members from non-Mekong region to encourage cross-border knowledge-sharing and mentorship.

Details of Delivery Phase

Project details:

As part of the current collaboration program, the faculty visited three centers in Cambodia and Vietnam: Calmette Hospital in Cambodia, and Cho Ray Hospital and University Medical Center in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam.

At the request of the Cambodian chapter, a two-day operative workshop was organized at Calmette Hospital. During the workshop, all surgical procedures were performed by the visiting faculty, with assistance from surgeons at Calmette Hospital.

Patients were admitted under the care of Calmette Hospital surgeons. The clinical details were shared with the operating faculty in advance, and they evaluated the patients a day before surgery. An informed consent was obtained, specifying that the procedures would be performed by the visiting faculty. Postoperatively, the operating faculty monitored the patients until November 6, after which ongoing care was provided by the surgeons and intensivists at

Calmette Hospital. All patients had an uneventful postoperative recovery and were discharged by November 14, 2024.

Use of Funding

The IHPBA Foundation provided a total funding of USD 9600 for the initiative.

USD 5530 was spent to cover hotel accommodation for seven nights in Cambodia and Vietnam.

USD 1125 was spent for lunch and dinner on days when meals were not arranged by the local organising committee. (Hosts arranged lunch and dinner on 4 days)

USD 1895 was spent on air and road fare for the regional and other faculty travelling within the Mekong region.

The remaining amount, USD 1050, was distributed equally among the external faculty (non-Mekong region) to offset their travel expenses partially.

Assessment of Impact

During the surgical planning session preceding the operative workshop, the faculty explained to the surgeons and trainees that the principles of preoperative preparation for complex HPB surgeries, emphasizing patient optimization and case selection.

During the operative workshop, two surgeons from Calmette Hospital actively participated in each surgical procedure, gaining hands-on exposure to the operative steps, anatomical nuances, complication management, and the appropriate use of advanced instrumentation. They identified gaps in their existing operative room practices, and practical suggestions were provided for improvement.

The academic session attended by 15 faculty members and surgical residents of Calmette Hospital focussed on case-based discussions that addressed a wide spectrum of HPB disorders. Recognising language barriers, Dr. Dara Vithiae facilitated by summarizing and translating key points into French, ensuring inclusivity. The three-day program in Cambodia received overwhelmingly positive feedback, marking it a significant milestone in regional surgical education.

In Vietnam, the board of directors meeting underscored the pivotal mentorship roles of Cho Ray Hospital and the University Medical Center in advancing surgical expertise across Cambodia, Vietnam, and Laos under the Mekong HPB Alliance. Both institutions pledged robust administrative support to the initiative.

At Cho Ray Hospital, 40 trainees and surgeons attended the academic sessions. The program was well-received, with dynamic interactions between faculty and participants, further cementing the Mekong HPB Alliance's regional collaboration and knowledge-sharing objectives.

Plans for ongoing project development or capacity building and support If applicable

Mekong HPB Exchange Program – The proposed Mekong HPB exchange program aims to foster collaboration and knowledge sharing by enabling faculty and trainees from Laos, Cambodia, and Myanmar to visit selected hospitals in Thailand and Vietnam. Key institutions such as Cho Ray Hospital and University Medical Centre have already committed to participating in this initiative, with formal MOUs to be facilitated by the IHPBA. Efforts are underway to expand the program through the Thailand and Vietnam chapters of IHPBA, ensuring broader hospital participation and regional integration.

Focus on Systems Development – Recognizing the importance of holistic healthcare improvement, the visiting faculty emphasized the need to develop systems rather than limiting the focus to surgeon training. As part of the exchange program, participating surgeons will be accompanied by nursing officers and support staff to foster team-based learning and optimize hospital workflows. Conversely, visiting teams from Thailand and Vietnam will include a

nurse and a support staff to assist in systems enhancement, ensuring that best practices are shared and implemented effectively. IHPAB can financially support the exchange program.

Conducting Regional Meetings – IHPBA can facilitate the organization of an annual Mekong HPB Conference, providing a platform for faculty and trainees across the region to share their research, present clinical data, and exchange knowledge. These meetings will foster collaboration and highlight regional advancements in HPB care. Additionally, dedicated sessions for the Mekong HPB Alliance can be incorporated into larger regional conferences such as APHPBA or ASEAN, offering greater visibility and opportunities for networking, collaboration, and the dissemination of best practices among member nations.

Developing a comprehensive training curriculum – The faculty emphasized the need to restructure the surgical training curriculum to enhance both theoretical knowledge and practical skills. The revised curriculum will prioritize hands-on skill development through innovative methods such as simulation-based learning, mentorship programs and use of technology like hololens for teleproctoring. The inclusion of competency-based assessments








